**Community Christian Choir Raises Funds for
Millstone Interfaith Quiet Fund**

May 9, 2008 – As part of its mission to serve the community, the Community Christian Choir gave a stirring concert on Sunday, May 4th as a benefit for the Millstone Interfaith Quiet Fund. Presenting it's program, "Center-Peace", the Choir raised \$899.11 for the fund, administered by the Millstone Interfaith Council, which provides funds for families in the Millstone area who are suffering financial problems due to illness or other distress. The concert, held at the Millstone Performing Arts Center in Perrineville, was the second concert in the 27th season. As with all its concerts, this concert was free to the public with a free-will offering taken during the concert. All proceeds are donated to the benefit charity.

"We were thrilled to once again perform in the beautiful facility here in Millstone for such a vital program in this community. The Council works hard to help those in need and we are proud to work with them," said Pat Weitz, director of the Community Christian Choir (www.ccchoir.com).

Having raised over \$120,000 over its 27 seasons, the Community Christian choir consists of over 130 members ranging in age from 5 to Adult.

Also performing and thrilling the audience was Mark Demel, known as the Sand Artist. Working with only a table, a box of sand and a light, Demel created images of faith and nature to express the sentiments and emotions brought on by the music. Performing during three songs by the choir, Demel delicately sprayed sand to create images of Christ on the cross, a whale, a swan and many others.

Beginning it's registration for the fall season (the choirs' 28th) on June 13 and 14, the choir ended this seasons' programs on Friday, May 9th with a concert to benefit The Ethan Fund at St. Martin of Tours Church in New Hope, PA.
